A variety of suppliers were used to source 'best of breed' playground equipment, giving the highest play value for the children .

Each play zone is clearly defined by using different surfacing textures and edgings including round log timbers, decking, sleeper walls, play sand, grass mats, resin bound gravel, wetpour and Enviromulch.

Throughout the whole site carefully positioned boulders and logs add an extra play platform, whilst Woodhenge activates the children's imagination and role playing skills.

The whole site has been landscaped and the excavated materials were used to create undulating mounds and pathways and the starter hill for the aerial runway, giving the playground a multi dimensional feel to it.

The pathways which lead from each access point are made up using different materials and all come together at the centre of the playground at the block paving maze.

The curving walls and edgings clearly define the boundaries of each play zone, yet remain pleasing to the eye.
